Expectations for Population Health & Health Equity Resident

Community Paramedics

G3 resident will accompany the HCMC community paramedics on their community visits. Our resident will function in a consultation role.

The learning goals of these visits are:

- 1) To learn about the community paramedic outreach program at HCMC
- 2) To have the opportunity to see how complex patients function in their home environment

Resident responsibilities will include:

- 1) Participating in the health tasks requested of the community paramedics
- 2) identifying areas of health care need for that patient
- 3) writing an EPIC clinical note (copy to the patient's PCP) documenting the visit including information that will help the PCP better address/understand the patient's needs
- 4) Residents will be with the Community Paramedics Fri. AM. **Residents should report to the EMS garage/lounge by 0700.** Community Paramedics are located in the same area that the Emergency Physicians have their offices, they're on the 1st level of the purple ramp. Enter through the door located on the southwest corner of 6 St & Park Av. All other doors are locked. Tell the front you are here to ride with the Community Paramedics.

You can take your own vehicle to the last appointment allowing you to leave on time to get to North Point Clinic.
