Call for Workshop Proposals NCEAS Annual Conference, February 23-February 24, 2026

The National Collaborative for Education to Address the Social Determinants of Health (NCEAS) is inviting proposals for workshop presentations from academic and professional communities for the 2026 virtual NCEAS Annual Conference. We welcome submissions describing research or innovations in social determinants of health (SDOH) education or practice. The conference workshop sessions will provide an opportunity for medical practitioners, educators and community organizations to present their work to other leaders and educators in SDOH and health disparities.

The aims of this conference are to:

- Examine how healthcare delivery is adapting to changes related to social determinants of health (SDOH) and the integration of social care into clinical settings.
- Discuss and explore how educators are teaching about social and structural drivers of health in clinical and classroom settings in the contemporary U.S. context.
- Share innovations in health professions education that prepare current and future providers to address SDOH and promote equitable, patient-centered care.
- Disseminate cutting-edge research, resources, and best practices that integrate SDOH into both clinical care and health professions education, with a focus on improving patient outcomes.

Workshop proposals should cover topics relevant to SDOH and/or health disparities and should align with specific conference aims. Example topics of interest include (but are not limited to) training curricula, screening and assessment tools, and case studies.

Selection of accepted workshops will be determined by review from the NCEAS conference committee. To submit a workshop proposal for consideration please review the details and requirements located below and submit online no later than **Friday, October 31**st, **2025** at 11:59PM (CST) to be eligible for consideration. Following our selection process, invitation letters will be sent out electronically by **Wednesday, December 17, 2025**.

With this being a virtual event, you will have the option to pre-record a 15-minute video for attendees to watch during the first 15 minutes of your workshop. Please let us know if you plan on doing this when submitting your proposal.

- You do not have to register for the conference to submit a workshop proposal. However, if your proposal is accepted for presentation, the facilitators(s) must register for the conference by the regular deadline and are responsible for registration fees. Registration will be opening soon.
